With their focus on career development, these courses empower educators by providing them with the best information available to help them guide their students toward career pathways aimed at future employment.

Virtual Education Toolkit

The Institute's book *Stone Soup for the World: Life-Changing Stories of Everyday Heroes*, and the accompanying educational curriculum, brings the traditional Stone Soup folk tale to life. Our **Virtual Education Toolkit** offers supplemental resources with 100 inspiring true stories and a companion curriculum; inspiring, professionally produced videos; and engaging activities in both English and Spanish. Piloted by the YMCA, the Institute's curriculum has been used in 120 communities to inspire and educate young people to become leaders in their communities as well as in our world. Our interactive digital content is available worldwide via the internet, and can be formatted or printed. It is also available in hard copy for use in rural and low-income communities that may not have access to reliable internet service.

The Courses

With the Institute's *Stone Soup for the World Educational Curriculum*, we are proud to have created a new model for inspiring, educating, and empowering students to enter STEM career pathways. This curriculum is for those who are working with young people in a variety of roles and settings—from teachers, to leaders of afterschool programs like the YMCA's, to AmeriCorps, Teacher Corps and Peace Corps volunteers – to spread the Stone Soup message around the world. Our four courses have been beta-tested in eight trials, both virtually and on location, working in collaboration with educators, employers, academies, charter schools, and community and youth leadership initiatives. These materials can be used by any school, and will be made available and promoted through the Institute's social media channels.

The Institute's Performance Metrics guide course development measures for teaching the skills that are most needed for the 21st century: Adaptability, Communication, Critical Thinking, Conflict Resolution, Teamwork, Project Management, Problem Solving, and Career Pathway Guidance. Data from our surveys suggests that educators and youth alike recognize the same structural issues when trying to navigate the landscape of education for jobs in sustainability: a lack of support in accessing proper mentoring, educational, and internship opportunities, as well as a lack of sufficient information, resources, and key educational courses in STEM. The Institute strives to use our actionable data to create a more equitable and sustainable educational environment.

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
