It's been an exciting year for the Stone Soup Leadership Institute. We are eager to carry this momentum forward into the New Year.

Stone Soup for a Sustainable World: Life-Changing Stories of Young **Heroes:** Given the urgency of our times, we responded to the strong demand to get our new book out -- in time to shine a light on our youth leaders before the **COP26** conference in Scotland. They spoke forcefully, making a strong argument for concerted action now. We received endorsements from celebrity, environmental and literary leaders: **Ted Danson**, **Matt Damon**, Dr. Jane Goodall, Dr. Sylvia Earle, Laura Dern, Danny Glover, Ed Begley Jr., Jean Michel Cousteau and Neil Gaiman. We leveraged our partnering organizations for the soft launch of the book in June. We have collaborated with organizational partners to develop dynamic educational tools, trainings, and resources that expand young people's appreciation for and interest in STEM, climate education, sustainable solutions and STEM-related career pathways. Our **SustainWDN**TM is an online ecosystem connecting business, educators and guidance counselors to help their students navigate sustainable career pathways in this new economy.

Our Goals for 2022

- **Leverage** our budget of \$500K to engage others to invest in our vision.
- **Scale Up** our sustainable education tools to train youth for green careers .
- Young Heroes Fund provide funds for youth leaders to scale up their work

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I. About the Stone Soup Leadership Institute

The Stone Soup Leadership Institute is a 501c3 nonprofit organization whose mission is to develop multicultural digital educational tools, vouth leadership initiatives, and technical assistance for sustainable workforce development. Founded in 1997 on Martha's Vineyard, we've synthesized the lessons we've learned along the way, and developed a grassroots model to train local leaders, exchange innovative solutions, and build resilient communities that can, by working together, build a better world. The Institute's Performance Metrics highlights the success of our youth leaders and include results from the qualitative results we've collected. The Institute is led by a loyal Board of Directors and distinguished International Advisory Council who guide our organization with strong management and diverse multicultural staff and with community engagement, gratitude from the educators, parents, and youth.

II. Educational Outreach: The Institute's BETA Sites: Youth & Community Leadership Initiatives

For the last 25 years, the Institute has been working alongside ocean communities—from Puerto Rico to Martha's Vineyard, from Hawaii to Rhode Island and from the British Virgin Islands to the Philippines. Our annual Sustainability Summits, Career Mentor & Job Shadow Day Program, College Prep and Community Service Programs and year-round youth community leadership initiatives help young people develop the skills they need to develop their personal, professional, and planetary goals. Youth leaders from these communities created a 2020 Report for Sustainable Development, challenging their leaders to develop policies that balance protecting their communities' fragile ecosystems, providing for their families, creating opportunities for their children, and building a just, equitable, and sustainable future. Through this work we've inspired hundreds of underserved multicultural youth around the world to become effective leaders.

Education Outreach: BETA Sites 2021-

The Institute is a Massachusetts-registered nonprofit organization training multicultural youth to be leaders in their lives, their communities, and our world. We have conducted BETA programs in Massachusetts communities, especially those focused on developing the Blue Economy and transitioning to a sustainable economy.





III. Educational Tools: Book & Curriculum

Stone Soup for a Sustainable World: Life-Changing Stories of Young Heroes features the stories of 100 climate change trailblazers. environmental justice changemakers, educator sustainable business champions, leaders, intergenerational legacy figures, green inventors and entrepreneurs, and emerging island leaders from 38 countries around the world, and 32 U.S. cities who are creating sustainability solutions to the global climate crisis. Their stories inspire us and their calls to action invite us to support them and their organizations to maximize their impact in building a more just, equitable, and sustainable world.

Sustainable Education Toolkit/Lesson Plans

At the Institute, we consider our partnership with schools to be crucial to our mission. We are partnering with school administrators across the country to facilitate the implementation of sustainability and STEM curricula in their schools. We are committed to providing dynamic resources for educators to increase their students' appreciation for STEM, with a special focus on climate education and sustainability solutions.

The Institute's Companion Educational **Curriculum** brings the stories in the book to life with lesson plans that highlight the values and basic academic disciplines of Language Arts and STEM activities, Sustainability Initiatives and provides guidance toward Sustainable Career Pathways. All of our educational tools and trainings are available through a virtual learning environment that adheres to state and NGIS (Next Generation State Standards), a set of standards focused on helping students develop a coherent and scientifically-based view of the world, convert their ideas into tangible, real-life projects, and focus on Physical and Life sciences, Earth and Space Science, and Engineering. These standards have been adopted by 27 states across the country.

V. Expansion Goals for 2022: Development; Educational Partnerships; and Multimedia

1. Educational Partnerships: Transition to Sustainable Economy

The Institute has longstanding relationships in schools and communities around the world, but these communities are small, and in some cases isolated. Language is a barrier, as is geography. With the proliferation of ed-tech tools that allow for reach and access to the most vulnerable among us around the globe, we have shifted our resources to help get our bilingual educational tools, books, and other multimedia works digitized and available for licensure in a digital portal at schools around the country and around the world. With these tools and trainings, we want to be able to provide jobs training and a pipeline to employment for people in those vulnerable groups who are most in need.

- **Professional Development Modules:** Provide educators with CEUs and licensing via ed-tech portals.
- Scaling Up: We've BETA-tested our educational platform in eight unique communities in the US around the world. We are eager to scale this platform to reach more schools and businesses nationwide and are partnering with forward-thinking allies across industries to help aid the youth who are eager to expand their passion for sustainable living to develop blue/green careers. These allies include progressive educators and career counselors; libraries and home schoolers seeking educational resources for bilingual learners; and schools in need of STEM resources to supplement their curricula. We are also partnering with an extensive team of Ph.D.s, MBAs, universities, and businesses across the green-blue sectors, environmental organizations, educational institutions, technical and vocational programs, as well as youth across the country who long to help to create a more equitable and sustainable future.
- **SustainWDN**TM is our cutting-edge digital workforce development network that builds bridges between young people, educators, and blue and green companies and is developing a 21st century workforce development pipeline. Its purpose is to provide youth from historically marginalized backgrounds with a pathway to high-paying technical jobs and internships in the world of sustainability. It offers educators and career counselors tools to guide students toward sustainable career pathways and also serves as an economic planning tool to help communities transition

to a sustainable economy. It can help companies realize a "triple bottom line" by preparing young people to contribute to a sustainable workforce, and a resilient community.

2. Multimedia Expansion: There's an everincreasing demand for high-quality sustainability resources such as curricular materials for educators, administrators, and schools, including material aimed at the cultural sphere. We are working in multiple verticals to make sustainable educational and entertainment material available to those who need it most. This offers an opportunity for sustainable media to gain a foothold and excerise the positive influence that's needed in our world. The Institute anticipates expanding our visibility on radio, podcasts, television, short films, TV series, and in other multimedia outlets.

3. Development: Leverage our budget of \$500K to engage others to invest in our vision.

- **Scale Up** our sustainable education tools to schools to train young people for sustainable career pathways.
- The **Young Heroes Fund** provide mentors, training, and financial support to help our youth leaders to scale up their work. In 2022 we will expand our base of givers with the aim of developing a safety net for young heroes who are on the front lines of climate change, especially those from the Global South. Now more than ever, the work of our young environmental leaders around the world needs to be highlighted and funded so they can scale up their efforts.

The Institute uses the Stone Soup model to invite everyone to share their time, talents, and resources to support young people so together we can build a more just, equitable, and sustainable world. We've developed partnerships and gathered significant media attention and funding. We've leveraged celebrity support to maximize the power of our social media campaigns—and have a positive impact on those who are on the frontlines doing the work to fight climate change. We are now well positioned to leverage our collective resources to nurture and support brave young people around the world who are working so hard to make a safe, healthy, and sustainable future for life on this planet.
