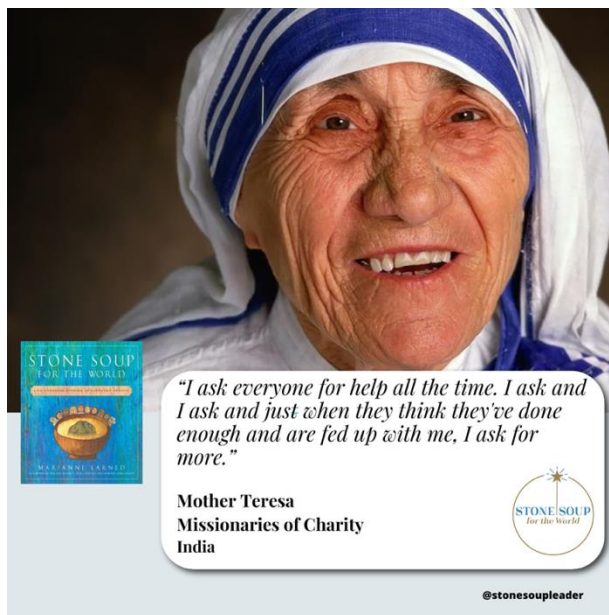

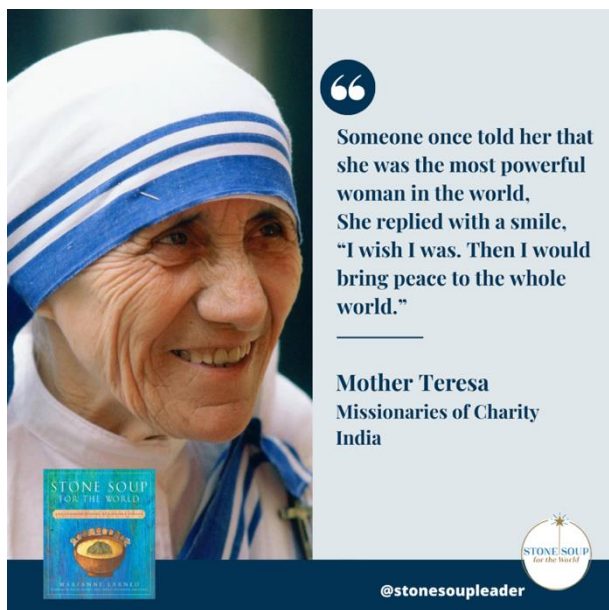


Sunday: Story

Wednesday: Honor Roll: Missionaries of Charity

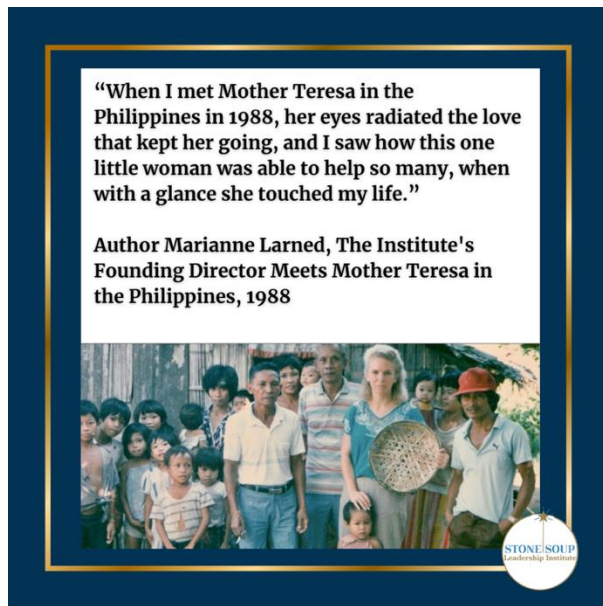
Mother Teresa's The Missionaries of Charity Sisters is a religious community in the Catholic Church founded in Calcutta, India.
