Sunday June 23: Story: The AIDS Memorial Quilt

READ how the AIDS Memorial Quilt was conceived by long-time human rights activist Cleve Jones and his friends as a way to honor San Francisco's Mayor George Moscone and Harvey Milk and loved ones who died from AIDS.

Cleve Jones received letters imploring him to bring the Quilt to their hometowns. He and his friends loaded up the Quilt, and set out across this country and around the world, displaying the Quilt as the centerpiece of local educational and fund-raising campaigns. What happened next helped shape the future for how our nation would remember those

who lost their lives due to the AIDS crisis.

Over the years, more than 7 million people visited the AIDS Memorial Quilt in its thousands of displays worldwide. Wherever it goes, the Quilt sparks a dialogue between those who make the panels and those who view them. A gift from the hearts and hands of Americans has touched millions of people and moved them to act, caring for the sick, comforting the dying, building hospices, joining speakers' bureaus, writing checks, signing petitions, demonstrating, testifying, getting arrested, wearing red ribbons, sewing Quilt squares for their own loved ones, and raising their own candles against the darkness.



Monday: June 24: The AIDS Memorial Quilt

The Names Project AIDS Memorial Quilt was first unfolded, on the National Mall in Washington, D.C., on October 11, 1987. It displayed 1,920 names.

There are now 48,000 panels – each a handmade memorial to a life lost to AIDS. Each one measures 6' by 3', the size of a grave. It is 1.2–1.3 million square feet and weighs 54 tons.


Cleve Jones and the story of the Quilt is featured in Stone Soup for the World and in the Stone Soup Educational Curriculum.

The National AIDS Memorial, through a partnership with the AIDS Quilt Touch team, brings together all 50,000 panels of the AIDS Memorial Quilt in an interactive experience so people around the world can experience the beauty of the Quilt and witness the love and stories stitched into each panel. It represents one of the largest acts of activism and social justice. The organization works to help ensure that the lives of people who died from AIDS are not forgotten and the story of AIDS is known by future generations - so that never again will a community be harmed because of fear, silence, discrimination, or stigma. https://www.aidsmemorial.org



Scholarships are essential for all students. We hope everyone will consider providing scholarships to the young people in your lives and in the world.




Friday: June 28: Lesson Plan: The AIDS Memorial Quilt

Saturday: June 29: Press: The AIDS Memorial Quilt

WATCH the Academy Award winning documentary film Common Threads: Stories of the Quilt. Narrated by Dustin Hoffman, with a musical score written and performed by Bobby McFerrin, the film focuses on five people who are in the Quilt, combining personal reminiscences with archive footage of the people and their families along with footage of health professionals, politicians and other people with AIDS.
