

• **Netherlands:** At age 6, <u>Lilly Platt</u>, shocked at what she learns about plastic pollution in the oceans, begins a determined campaign to fight it. By the time she is 8, she has started a <u>Facebook page</u>. By the time she is 12 she and her followers have picked up 200,000 pieces of plastic and she has collected numerous awards and become an internationally known environmental advocate. Lilly's irrepressible spirit is contagious: "Who's with me?" she asks: a call to action that is hard to resist.

- Barcelona: Francois Van Den Abeele, a young entrepreneur creates a successful business (<u>Sea2See</u>) making fashionable eyewear out of plastic waste retrieved from the ocean. "United we're much stronger...and by combining all these positive energies people are trying to do things differently..."
- **Mumbai**: As a schoolgirl Aadya Joshi turns a scrapyard in her neighborhood into an urban garden. This leads to her passionate interest in biodiversity, and in teaching others about the importance of protecting native plants through her organization <u>The Right Green</u>.
- **Uganda**: <u>Vanessa Nakate</u> stands alone outside her parliament building, holding up signs about the urgency of climate action; she is now an internationally known spokeswoman for the movement, and founder of Rise Up Movement Africa.
- Washington DC: As a high school student, Jerome Foster II awakens to the connection between social justice issues and the climate crisis and helps Jane Fonda organize Fire Drill Fridays in front of the White House. Now 19, Jerome is working inside the White House as the youngest member of President Biden's White House Environmental Justice Advisory Council,
